April is a time for new life. We usually experience our first extended time of bright, warm sunshine, we get to visit tulip fields, and we have to start cutting our grass constantly. For me and Valerie, April will be the month that we welcome our first child. For our Christian family, April is the month that we celebrate the resurrection of Christ.

April is a time for new life.

Recently, I have been thinking about the way that we talk about and experience life and death as Christians. Often, we think of life as temporary and death as final, we talk as if the eternal life that we have with Christ exists in the enormous shadow cast by the death and decay of our earthly bodies. And I understand why. Physical death feels so final to the living. Death means the end of everything natural that we experience as humans, and (naturally) those are the things that often grab our focus.

But life is more real than death.

As Christians, we know this truth. We know that resurrection and eternal life are waiting for us, we know that death is a temporal experience but life is an eternal reality. But we (maybe this is just my problem) struggle to acknowledge this reality in our daily lives.

When Jesus came to Mary and Martha after the death of Lazarus, He said to them, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die." Jesus follows up this statement with a question, "Do you believe this?" And I believe He is asking us the same thing.

In the Genesis creation account, each day ends with a similar statement, "And there was evening and there was morning..." For the Jewish people, their Sabbath days worked like this too. The day started with the evening. It is almost impossible for me to retrain my brain to think that way. The day begins as I go to sleep...but this was how they lived. We have a similar problem with life and death. We believe that we live and then we die, but what the Bible teaches us is that we are dead until we are brought into life eternal. Ephesians 2 begins with this declaration, "You were dead." Paul's next declaration comes in verse four, "But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ." Friends, we were dead; we are now alive. We are now alive in an eternal way. Your spirit, joined together with Christ in His resurrection is never going to die. We have been promised, and we have received, eternal life. We have received a life that overthrows death.

As you think about Easter this year, as you consider resurrection, remember the power that saved you; remember the power that brought you out of death and into life; remember the eternal nature of your salvation.

Death is swallowed up in victory.

O death, where is your victory?

O, death, where is your sting?
