As we were passing this rental area, Everett and Gregory suddenly got really excited and desperately tried to direct Christine's and my attention to a posthole auger that sat right in the middle. Out of all of the interesting tools that they could have been excited about, why had they chosen the one that was nearly buried by the hundred or more tools surrounding it?

In order for you to understand Everett and Gregory's excitement, you need to know that we rented that exact auger last spring to drill a number of holes around our backyard. The reason the auger stood out to Everett and Gregory, among all of the other tools, was because **they knew its purpose**! They had seen it, used it, and were very familiar with what it was designed to do.

One of the tools at EBC that I (and I am guessing a few others) have not gotten very excited about is this paper you are holding, *The Edge* (our monthly newsletter). As I was reading some EBC policy recently, I came across a few things written about *The Edge* that made me realize I was not very familiar with the purpose of this tool. Let me share a bit of what I discovered...

First, the policy says, "The purpose of The EDGE is primarily to be a communication tool for promoting/facilitating body life here at Emmanuel." As soon as I read this main purpose statement, I got more excited about this tool. I care a lot about body life here at EBC and am interested in anything that assists in promoting/facilitating it. However, it was the last sentence of the paragraph that really stood out to me. It says this, "A major goal (of The Edge) will be to remind us to intercede for God's working among us." What if we read the section featuring a few of our missionaries and then spent some time praying for them? This month, I can't wait for *The Edge* to arrive because I have a new understanding of its purpose!


