ELLS International is Spreading Its Wings

f money were no object and the sky was the limit, I would charter two 747s and fly our whole church to Africa to see and experience what God is doing through the ministry of ELLS International. The most exciting, most invigorating, most gratifying thing I've ever experienced is being in a room packed with dozens of impoverished, uneducated, ill-equipped pastors who are learning how to study, interpret, and preach the Word of God. I wish you could see the eagerness on their faces. I wish you could observe the way they listen, the way they take notes, and the way they cherish the notebooks we provide. I wish you could see "the lights go on" in their minds as they absorb the teaching. And I wish you could sit with them at lunchtime under the shade of a tree and hear their personal stories. I think you would be as enthralled as me, and I think you might become as endeared to these brothers and sisters in Christ as I

I also think you would be convinced that there are few things in this world more valuable than what ELLS International is doing in terms of kingdom advancement. We have now completed our three to five year training course in six regions of Kenya and Uganda, averaging approximately 175 pastors and church leaders at each conference. During this time, more than 700 pastors have received certificates of completion, meaning that they attended every conference and did all the course work (many more pastors started attending in the second or third year of the conference, and thus have not completed all the course work). This means that hundreds of local pastors are better equipped to preach and teach God's word with accuracy and competency. The result is a stronger, more mature church in these developing countries, and the opportunity to raise up an army of disciples who can help fulfill the Great Commission. Nearly a thousand local churches and forty thousand individuals have been impacted by the ministry of ELLS in just seven years!

This has happened with a bumbling, volunteer Executive Director (me!), limited time and resources, and an absence of sustainable funding which is evidence that God has done this! What is more, ELLS International has received at least a dozen requests in the last year to begin its program in countries and regions where we have never been. In late March and early April we will be going to three countries and meeting with representatives of twelve African nations who are pleading with us to begin the ELLS program in their respective regions. The requests go something like this:

- "We don't have anything like ELLS International in West Africa, and it is badly needed"
- "We are desperate to learn how to preach and teach the word with power and clarity, and there is not one Bible training institute in our country. Please come and teach us!"
- "What ELLS is doing is exactly the kind of training we need. If our churches are going to be strong we have to learn how to accurately interpret the Word and preach it with integrity. Please help us!"

But what to do with all these invitations? I can barely keep up with all my responsibilities as senior pastor of Emmanuel Bible Church. If ELLS International is going to even begin to respond to these pleas, we obviously need more resources and personnel. Someone needs to give this ministry their full-time, undivided attention. And that someone needs to be highly qualified and specifically called for this unique ministry.

That brings me to Grant Clay, the senior pastor of Clay Center Covenant Church in Clay Center, Kansas. Grant was a member of the ELLS International team last June, and he preached and taught a number of times in the four towns in which we conducted our conferences. He adapted remarkably well to the culture and challenges of a developing country. He saw the need firsthand, and it was an even greater need than he had realized. He got to see the inner workings of ELLS International, meet and befriend the African team members, and actively engage in the program. He also fell in love with the African pastors and was captured by their eagerness to learn and implement the teachings.

Pastor Grant is eminently qualified for the position of Executive Director. He has two Master's degrees and is nearing completion of his Ph.D. in hermeneutics (the science and art of biblical interpretation), which is the most substantive part of ELLS International's curriculum. His wife, Suzanne, has a rich history in missions, and they have three children.

By faith, the Board of ELLS International has extended a call to Pastor Grant to serve as full time Executive Director beginning August 1. This will necessitate a transition for the Clay family from Kansas to Oregon (the Salem/Silverton area). It will also require that we have adequate funds in order to secure Grant's services, and ensure the health and longevity of ELLS International. We have set a target and are trusting the Lord to provide \$150,000 by July 1. This amount would cover Grant's first year's salary and benefits, 2019 office expenses, and the 2019 ELLS program.

You will be hearing much more from me about ELLS International in the days to come. When I return from my trip to Africa, I will spend a Sunday morning (April 14) giving you a report and talking about what God is doing.

May the Lord continue to bless this ministry, and may He strengthen His church in remote areas of the developing world!


