THE QUESTIONS IN SERVING


"How about a rematch in ping-pong?" a confident third-grader asked.

"Can I show you what new verse I highlighted in my Bible?" inquired the bright-eyed sixth-grader.

"Will you teach me how to whistle like that?" a lively fifth-grader exclaimed.

"May I sing 'At the Cross' for you?" said the soft-spoken and shy first-grader.

"Will you *please* come to my graduation?" pleaded the eighth-grade girl with a big smile.



Since September, for two hours each week in the After School Program, I've been serenaded and spoiled by a room full of young people — image-bearers full of life and potential — who attend school a mere half-mile from Emmanuel Bible Church. What do they think each day as they pass our church and see the cross upon this building? Do they know about God? Have they heard that Jesus loves them? Do they even know God uniquely made them for a purpose? That they have infinite value? Do they know this place they pass is full of love and hope, peace and support? Do they experience those things at home?

But I would never have been aware to ask these questions about our surrounding community kids without first answering a question asked of me.

On a Sunday morning this past August, shortly after moving to Oregon from Florida, I was made aware of the needs in the After School Program, when the congregation was asked "Will you consider serving?" Immediately following this request, my heart heard my Lord ask, "Will you serve Me?" Our silent conversation in the pew went something like this:

- -"Lord, we just moved here and I'm exhausted and overwhelmed."
- -"I know... Will you serve Me?"
- -"Lord, everything is new and how do I know filling this need is where I'm called?"
- -"I know... Will you serve Me?"
- -"Lord, I'm not from a rural community what if I can't relate?"
- -"I know... And you keep calling me 'Lord'... Will you serve Me?"

Although surrounded by other worshipers in the pews, I was now sitting alone with Adonai, Who was awaiting my answer. My continued and acceptable worship of Him that Sunday now hinged on my reply.

The One Who came, not to be served, but to serve, was seeking a willing heart to serve.

Serving the Lord in the After School Program has been indescribably rewarding. And in my desire to obediently serve and ultimately bless the Lord by serving others, I am the one who has been showered with His blessings: new and precious friendships have been forged with others with whom I serve, opportunities to show His love to these kids so they can know they are valued and loved by God, stewarding faithfully the gifts He's given me, building relationships with the Pratum schoolchildren... and, of course, their questions — which have served to inspire me to serve all the more!

What a blessing to be able to share the gospel with over 150 kids this year in AWANA. Not only were they presented with the gospel on many occasions, but for those who have already committed their lives to Jesus, their faith was challenged and encouraged to grow. Through memorizing Scripture, studying the Bible in their handbooks, and listening to our enthusiastic and creative teachers, AWANA kids were given an opportunity to deepen their knowledge and love of Christ.

Camille W. was our AWANA missionary this past year. Kids gave out of the bucks they earned to support families in Nicaragua with baskets that included some necessities and some fun extras, children's books that talk about the love of Jesus and creation, and also provided help with medical transportation for those in a remote area. It's a blessing to see how generous these kids are and how willingly and cheerfully they give.

One of the highlights from our year was the Grand Prix, which is a pinewood derby car race. Kids did an amazing job of designing and painting their cars. This event encourages kids and parents to work together as they cut and design the cars. It is also one of the opportunities we provide for the kids, and others that they bring, to hear about Jesus.

Here are some other interesting pieces of information from this year. AWANA has over 50 volunteers, from high school age through grandparents, who serve with joy and enthusiasm. AWANA would not be as much fun, or as effective, without these faithful volunteers! There were eight 5th and 6th graders who participated on the T&T worship team. This was the first year we had more T&T clubbers, 3-6th graders, than Sparkies, K-2nd graders. And this past year saw over 80% of kids complete their handbooks, which includes studying and memorizing God's Word. We are praising God for this opportunity to teach kids truth and look forward to see how God uses His Word to accomplish His purposes in their lives.

It comes at the end of our time each week when we ask questions about what we've talked about and hear these little ones answer excitedly about Jesus! It is the most precious feeling ever! It feels better than anything money can buy! It is truly rewarding to the soul to teach children about our great God and Savior! Matthew 18 describes how Jesus feels about little ones, when He says, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven." Wow! Our Lord says we need to be humble like these little ones to be great in His kingdom. What a better way to start than to hang out with them and talk about Jesus!

GOD IS NOT AFRAID OF OUR DOUBTS

In March, I taught a lesson called "Thomas the Doubter" during storytelling time for our kindergarten through fifth grade kids. We talked about Jesus kindly explaining to Thomas that those who believe He is the Messiah without seeing Him are blessed (John 20:29). At that moment, a brave young lady spoke up and said, "Sometimes I have a hard time believing that Jesus is real." I had to smile because I know how she feels.

Mindy first approached me about being a storyteller in our Sunday School program years ago shortly after I graduated college. I read her description of what storytellers do and shrugged, thinking, "I can do that, no problem." But as soon as that prideful thought formed, a verse entered my head that I could not ignore: "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a great millstone fastened around his neck and to be drowned in the depth of the sea" (Matthew 18:6). I've never felt more convicted in my life. I realized I wasn't living like I believed Jesus was real. I knew the stories and the things other believers told me, but it wasn't enough. Like Thomas, I wanted more proof that Jesus was worth my whole life. Telling Mindy I could not be a storyteller at that time was the moment my doubts, which had become deadly comfortable, came sharply into focus.

After a few years of varied crises and painful spiritual growth spurts, Mindy asked me again about being a storyteller. She could not have picked a time when I felt less qualified. I no longer felt prideful in my teaching skills. Instead, I was petrified by a fear of hypocrisy. Who am I to teach these "little ones" spiritual truth? How can I teach anyone when I myself struggle with the things I am trying to explain? But God says, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). God taught me to lean on His power and nothing else; then He gave me the chance to share His truth with others. The best story time lessons I've ever experienced contained moments when I heard myself saying something I knew was not my own thought. I heard myself reassuring a little girl that God is not afraid of our doubt and He is excited to help us grow in belief, for "He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion" (Philippians 1:6). I needed to hear that more than she did, I'm sure. Praise God, for He does not abandon us in our sinful pride or our fearful trembling. He continues to work and makes us vessels for His truth. In our imperfections, God's strength is made known and He is glorified.

God does not take the instruction of His children lightly, and neither should we. But God does not exclude us from His plans because we are not qualified. He equips us as we go so long as we rely on Him; He grants us what we need when we need it. The last eight months of story telling in our Children's Ministries have taught me that. I believe Jesus is real, and sharing that belief with the kids here at Emmanuel Bible Church is the most important thing I have ever done. I am so grateful teaching here is a part of God's plan for me.
