The Baptism of Jesus

Matthew 3:13-17

Main Idea: Why should we continue to follow Jesus Christ and His commitment to make disciples of all nations?

1) 3:2, 15. repent. turn from self, turn to God.

Jesus is always with us, and He is always inviting us to a close walk with Him. Looking back on this past week, <u>when</u> and <u>where</u> in your week can you identify that you sensed Jesus was inviting you to a closer walk with Him?

2) 3:13 – 15. baptism. die to self, live resurrected new life to God. <u>Can you identify an activity</u> that you could reduce/stop from your schedule, in order to have more time to walk closer to Jesus?
***"walk closer" - is not limited to personal devotion time, but also might include: helping with EBC's AWANA ministry, After School ministry, Under the Bridge ministry, helping with the Global ministry. 3) 3:16, 17. God's Affirming Presence.

This passage *does not only* reveal God's approval of Jesus.

Through this passage <u>God continues to reveal His heart for the nations</u> <u>and peoples of the world</u>.

In the Gospel of Matthew, concerning God's heart for the nations of the world, how many direct references and indirect references, how many allusions can you find?
